Agreed Removal Decision

Registrant: Angela Jenner

Part(s) of the register: Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

Relevant Location: Derbyshire

On 6 March 2024 we received a referral raising a concern about Angela Jenner's fitness to practise. It's alleged that on 3 and 4 December 2023 Angela Jenner:

- provided poor patient care, in that she failed to escalate a deteriorating resident or conduct clinical observations on them
- failed to contact the resident's next of kin when they were unwell
- asked the resident's family member to lie and say she had contacted them, when she had not.

The case was referred for further investigation and consideration by the case examiners. No allegation against Angela Jenner has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

Angela Jenner has said that she did provide care to the resident when they were unwell, however she admits that she failed to appropriately escalate their deterioration or conduct clinical observations on them and that she failed to contact the next of kin. Locally, she admitted to 'panicking' and asking the resident's family member to lie.

On 20 September 2024 we received an application from Angela Jenner for agreed removal from the NMC register.

ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Angela Jenner's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation about Angela Jenner
- Angela Jenner's agreed removal application form and supporting documents
- evidence obtained in the case
- that the episode of dishonesty was a spontaneous, isolated incident and posed no direct risk to people receiving care

- the interests of Angela Jenner
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Angela Jenner no longer intends to work as a registered nurse
- the allegations against Angela Jenner aren't likely to result in a striking off order
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Angela Jenner to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 18 December 2024. In the event that Angela Jenner seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
