## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the order at this meeting and Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on her behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku must inform her case officer if she would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku and her representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Mrs Nwachukwu-Udaku in writing.
