## Agreed Removal Decision

**Registrant:** Glitter Joy Zabala

**PIN:** 22H08110

**Part(s) of the register:** Registered Nurse - Adult Nursing

**Relevant Location:** Greater London

On 1 September 2022 we received a referral raising a concern about Glitter Joy Zabala's fitness to practise. The referral gave rise to a concern that Glitter Joy Zabala has a health condition capable of impairing her fitness to practise.

We investigated the issue and the matter was referred to the Fitness to Practise Committee. No allegation against Glitter Joy Zabala has yet been found substantively proved by one of our statutory committees.

On 6 October 2024 we received an application from Glitter Joy Zabala for agreed removal from the NMC register.

### **ASSISTANT REGISTRAR'S DECISION**

As an Assistant Registrar, I have delegated authority to make decisions about agreed removal and have agreed to removal from the NMC register in this case.

In accordance with Rule 14 of the Nursing and Midwifery Council (Education, Registration and Registration Appeals) Rules 2004, in considering Glitter Joy Zabala's application for agreed removal, I've taken into account:

- comments received from the person that made the allegation against Glitter Joy Zabala
- Glitter Joy Zabala's agreed removal application
- evidence obtained in the case
- the interests of Glitter Joy Zabala
- the public interest.

I'm satisfied that:

- Glitter Joy Zabala no longer intends to work as a registered nurse in the UK
- the allegations against Glitter Joy Zabala are not so serious as to be fundamentally incompatible with continued registration
- there are no other good reasons requiring us to consider the allegations further at this time
- the public interest is best served by agreeing the application for removal and enabling Glitter Joy Zabala to leave the NMC register.

We'll publish a record of this decision for twelve months from the date of the decision, 1 November 2024. In the event that Glitter Joy Zabala seeks readmission to the register, we may consider the matters that led to this agreed removal further.
