Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to vary the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel was of the view that the public would remain suitably protected by the variation of the following conditions:

For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must restrict your nursing practice to NHS Highland Health Board.
2. You must ensure that you are directly supervised anytime you are working. Your supervision must consist of working at all times while being directly observed by another registered nurse.
3. You must meet with your line manager or supervisor on a fortnightly basis to discuss your clinical practice in the following areas of concern:
 - Medication administration and management
 - Caring for deteriorating patients
 - Formulating and following care plans
 - Record keeping
 - Taking basic clinical observations
 - Communication with patients and colleagues

You must provide a report from your line manager or supervisor about the standard of your practice in these areas to the NMC before any review of your case.

4. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
 - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of leaving any employment.

- b) Giving your case officer your employer's contact details.
5. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
- a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.
6. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
- a) Your current employer.
 - b) [PRIVATE]
 - c) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.
7. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
- a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.
8. You must allow your case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
- a) Your current employer.
 - b) [PRIVATE]
 - c) Any educational establishment.
 - d) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions.

Unless your case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, you or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review, the reviewing panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim conditions of practice order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

In certain circumstances, it may be possible for the interim conditions of practice order to be reviewed by a reviewing panel at an administrative meeting. Your case officer will write to you about this in due course.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against you. The NMC will write to you when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to you in writing.

That concludes this determination.
