Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to make an interim conditions of practice order for a period of six months.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery or nursing associates.

1. You must limit your nursing practice to East Kent Hospitals University NHS Trust.
2. You must ensure that you are supervised any time you are working. Your supervision must consist of being directly observed by either, another registered nurse, a medically qualified person or another allied health professional.
3. You must have fortnightly meetings with your line manager, mentor, or supervisor to discuss your performance in relation to:
 - Professional relationships with colleagues; and
 - Your professional conduct within the workplace.
4. You must obtain a report from your line manager, mentor or supervisor which focuses on your performance in relation to:
 - Professional relationships with colleagues; and
 - Your professional conduct within the workplace.

This report must be sent to the NMC prior to any review.

5. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are working by:
 - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of leaving any employment.

6. You must keep the NMC informed about anywhere you are studying by:
 - a) Telling your case officer within seven days of accepting any course of study.
 - b) Giving your case officer the name and contact details of the organisation offering that course of study.

7. You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to:
 - a) Any organisation you work for.
 - b) Any establishment you apply to (at the time of application), or with which you are already enrolled, for a course of study.

8. You must tell your NMC case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
 - a) Any clinical incident you are involved in.
 - b) Any investigation started against you.
 - c) Any disciplinary proceedings taken against you.

9. You must allow your NMC case officer to share, as necessary, details about your performance, your compliance with and / or progress under these conditions with:
 - a) Your current employer.
 - b) Any educational establishment.
 - c) Any other person(s) involved in your retraining and/or supervision required by these conditions.

Unless your case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, you or the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review a panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against you. The NMC will write to you when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This will be confirmed to you in writing.
