## **Decision and reasons on interim order**

The panel decided to confirm the current interim suspension order.

Unless there has been a material change of circumstances, a panel will review the interim suspension order at an administrative meeting within the next six months. The reviewing panel will be invited by the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC) to confirm the order at this meeting and Mr McNulty will be notified of that panel's decision in writing following that meeting.

Alternatively, Mr McNulty is entitled to have the interim suspension order reviewed at a hearing. This means that Mr McNulty will be able to attend and make representations, send a representative on his behalf or submit written representations about whether the order continues to be necessary. Mr McNulty must inform his case officer if he would like the interim suspension order to be reviewed at a hearing.

Even if Mr McNulty does not request a hearing, where there has been a material change of circumstances that might mean that the order should be revoked or replaced, a panel will review the order at a hearing to which Mr McNulty and his representative will be invited to attend.

This decision will be confirmed to Mr McNulty in writing.
