Decision and reasons on interim order

The panel decided to vary the current interim conditions of practice order.

The panel has determined that the following conditions are proportionate and appropriate:

'For the purposes of these conditions, 'employment' and 'work' mean any paid or unpaid post in a nursing, midwifery, or nursing associate role. Also, 'course of study' and 'course' mean any course of educational study connected to nursing, midwifery, or nursing associates.'

- 8. You must meet with your Line manager, mentor, or supervisor at least every two weeks to discuss [PRIVATE].
- You must send your NMC Case Officer prior to any review hearing, a report from your Line manager, mentor or supervisor commenting on [PRIVATE].
- 10. You must inform the NMC if you leave your current employer within seven days of your employment ceasing.

- You must immediately give a copy of these conditions to Albrighton Medical Practice.
- 12. You must tell your case officer, within seven days of your becoming aware of:
 - a. [PRIVATE]

 - c. [PRIVATE]

Unless your case has already been concluded, this interim order must be reviewed before the end of the next six months and every six months thereafter. Additionally, you or the NMC may ask for the interim order to be reviewed if any new evidence becomes available that may be relevant to the interim order.

At any review a panel may revoke the interim order or any condition of it, it may confirm the interim order, or vary any condition of it, or it may replace the interim conditions of practice order with an interim suspension order.

The NMC Case Examiners are yet to decide whether there is a case to answer in relation to the allegations made against you. The NMC will write to you when the case is ready for the next stage of the fitness to practise process.

This decision will be confirmed to you in writing.
