SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The University comprises a structure of Schools working directly with Central Support Services since a restructure in 2009/10. It is proposed that a further restructure affecting the two schools involved in this review (School of Nursing and Caring Science and School of Public Health) which will result in NMC programmes being available with a new School formed from January 2011. There are 5 trained NMC Reviewers in the schools and organisation of the review was excellent including a self evaluation document categorising activities and documents under NMC risk sections.

There is strong evidence of a progressive learning organisation, a positive culture and enthusiastic and highly professional staff. All people reported that the University provides an excellent service and students confirmed that they would recommend the programmes over others delivered by other Universities.

The University provides a wide range and variety of pre and post registration programmes. Staff are well qualified and all have experience commensurate with the programmes. Staff development is exceptional. There are sufficient numbers of staff available to support the volume of students.

There are sufficient mentors available. Admission and selection is robust with all NMC requirements met. There are a number of practice partnership arrangements with joint membership of panels and committees and relationships are excellent. Audits are current. Service User development is exceptional. All mentor registers are accurate. Service reconfiguration is projected and planned for so that there are no capacity issues or instances where too many students are placed at any one time. There are no current investigations or clinical governance incidents where students are placed. A previous incident followed safeguarding processes. Policies and procedures for safeguarding are in place. Student raising concerns processes are in place and the recent NMC guideline is included in a student placement handbook. Fitness for Practice procedures are in place with joint membership of academic and service staff. Student conduct is monitored and cases referred to the Fitness for Practice Panel are managed and all details recorded.

Quality assurance procedures are robust.
