SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The School of Health and Social Care effectively controls NMC key risks in the delivery of the Independent and Supplementary Nurse Prescribing V300 and the Overseas Nursing Programme. The programme leads are NMC recordable and registrant teachers. Both have the appropriate qualifications and practice experience required to support their teaching activities. Records of academics teaching on the NMC programmes demonstrate that there are sufficient qualified academics with NMC recordable/registration to support the NMC provision.

The University has very good teaching and learning facilities for all students including libraries, virtual learning environment (VLE), skills suites and internet access from service provider sites. Students on the programmes confirmed that they are well supported and the staff very contactable.

Admission processes meet NMC requirements for both programmes and there are clear processes in place to ensure that students meet conduct and health requirements. Failing/or poor practice issues/concerns are identified and dealt with by the Academic Offences and Fitness to Practise procedures.

Partnership working remains very effective and is highly valued by all the partners; the





review team commend the university.

Practice learning continues to be well managed through a number of effective partnerships and processes which work extremely well including the Locality Practice Learning Groups (LPLG's) and the University Placement Learning Advisors (UPLA's). Trust databases are maintained and updated regularly. The University maintains the DMP list and they are well prepared for their role by the programme team.

Students from the V300 are reported as very well prepared and competent for their role. ONP students evaluate the programme positively and some 1800 have been registered with the NMC to date with over 400 in the last year.

Robust quality assurance systems are in place to regulate all the NMC programmes.
