#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

The programmes for Pre-Registration Midwifery (3 year and 18 month), Supervisor of Midwives and Overseas Nursing provided by the Faculty of Health, Sport and Science, University of Glamorgan have the Key Risks controlled.

The Teaching team are appropriately qualified and have qualifications commensurate with their role. Programme leaders are NMC recordable teachers with current PIN and renewal status. Teachers are well managed and demonstrate enthusiasm and commitment to their programmes and the students confirm that they are very well supported and that the faculty is extremely facilitative to students requiring additional help and support to complete their studies.

The University has had considerable investment in buildings and teaching accommodation on the Glyntaff campus, library and VLE and a state- of- the- art Simulation Centre which successfully impacts on the students learning experience.

All teachers have multiple roles and workload is monitored by the line managers and agreed at yearly appraisals. Teachers have link areas with designated responsibilities and a personal teacher role, which is much valued by the student body.

Admission systems for all three programmes are well controlled and meet NMC requirements

APL procedures are in place in the faculty; however, they are not used for the programmes under review. Poor performance is dealt with by fitness to practise processes and penalties applied if necessary. Very few cases are reported and all five cases from the 2010 academic year are still on their programmes.

Practice Learning is effectively managed through a central department. The faculty has invested in a web based system called Student Placement Allocation Clinical Evaluation (SPACE) which will when fully operational enable students and service provider's to access placement information. Practice Facilitators are pivotal to the successful training and updating of mentors in the Health Boards and working collaboratively with the teaching team. Audits are undertaken by the teachers and information is held by the partners with the Practice facilitators who maintain the databases of mentors, sign-off status and recording the triennial review activities. Annual audits are in place for the overseas programme, however triennial review information is not evident and essential skills training needs to be accurately recorded in the student's portfolio. The university database for mentors in the Care sector needs strengthening.

Evidence from service providers and external examiners confirm that the students exiting from these programmes are fit for the award/purpose and practice. Employers and service providers in the Health boards and Independent and Private sector reported the excellent level of partnership working that they have with the faculty. The review team commend this activity.

Quality assurance mechanisms were found to be very robust and communication between the partners clearly demonstrated at operational and strategic levels.
