SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

London South Bank University currently provides a comprehensive range of pre-registration and post-registration programmes and the Faculty has appropriate numbers of teachers with relevant experience and qualifications to support the programmes offered. In addition, there are sufficient numbers of mentors, sign-off mentors and practice teachers to support students in practice. Mentors and practice teachers are released to attend mentor/practice teacher preparation and NHS partners have included mentor updates in Trusts' mandatory training to assure high levels of attendance. Where challenges are experienced in releasing mentors for update alternative arrangements are in place for updates to be provided in Directorates and wards.

The Faculty has well established admission processes with appropriate controls to ensure good character and good health prior to students working with patients and service users and at progression points throughout the programme. Students are selected jointly with service providers. The University and School have clear and well understood processes for the management of poor performance in both theory and practice ensuring consistency of application across the University whilst meeting NMC regulatory requirements.

The Faculty demonstrates strong partnership working with NHS London, other education providers and service provider partners at strategic and operational levels. All clinical placements have been audited and processes have been introduced to moderate placement

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audits. NHS service provider partners have arrangements in place for the regular monitoring of the quality of nursing and midwifery care and action has been taken in conjunction with the School to address adverse Care Quality Commission findings. Mentors are appropriately prepared and updated and arrangements for Triennial Reviews have been implemented but there is a requirement to ensure consistency and improvement in processes to record Triennial Review. Trust mentor registers are comprehensive, accurate and up to date. Practitioners are closely engaged in the development and delivery of approved programmes. Similarly, there is good engagement with service users in all programmes reviewed. Sound arrangements are in place for the assurance of mentor inter-rater reliability, particularly with regard to the processes for moderation of practice assessments.

The Faculty employs a wide range of teaching and learning and assessment strategies to enable students to meet the required NMC outcomes and proficiencies. The SCPHN: OH programme team are commended for the use of innovative teaching and learning opportunities which meet the needs of students based in very diverse placement settings. Students are required to maintain a record of all assessments throughout their programmes. EU Directive requirements are met in full in both the pre-registration nursing and midwifery programmes.

The Faculty complies with sound University quality assurance requirements and there is good evidence of external examiner engagement in the assessment of practice. Programmes are approved according to University guidelines; all approval panels include the appropriate regulatory bodies.

Employers, managers and mentors report a high level of satisfaction with the programmes and confirm that students are fit for purpose and for practice at the point of qualification.
