

Who are practice assessors and how are they prepared?

<u>Practice assessors</u> are registered nurses, midwives, and nursing associates, or in the case of prescribing programmes any qualified prescriber, who assess a student's practice learning for a <u>placement or a series of</u> <u>placements</u>. A nominated practice assessor also works with the academic assessor to make <u>recommendations for</u> <u>progression</u> for the student they are assigned to.

They have been <u>prepared and supported</u> to take up their role and have <u>current knowledge and experience</u> relevant for the proficiencies and programme outcomes they are assessing.
